- Include: basic identifying information Brief history/presenting problem. Formulation: describe the problem and the internal dynamics:

Relevant predisposing factor/history development considerations/family constellation.

- Describe patient's object relations. Identify defenses/aims of treatment.
- It is an exercise that will not be included in the candidate's file.
